He has also had the opportunity to work and train in the backcountry of Mt Revelstoke, Glacier, Yoho, Banff, Lake Louise, and Kootenay National Parks in the Canadian Rockies.

He was a land team member, interviewing Inuit on health-related issues, resiliency against the harsh climate, living conditions, and food security in their communities.
